Feb 8, 2024 will be 10 weeks prior to the Orange Crush weekend advertised by promoters.

need to have to protect against damage to city, state, business property, personal injury?

3) Are we in continuous discussion with the promotors.

• Myself and Assistant Chief Whitley met with Britian Wigfall approximately 3 times. The latest being 01/22/2024. Two additional times Mr. Wigfall was with Christian Shelley and Julia Pearce.

What is their liability for issues during the event?

Will they be partners in resolving conflicts during the event?

7) What requests of additional staffing support and coordination have been requested from the County and State Police and other agencies?

- OC2024 promoter Britian Wigfall announced OC2024 on 11/28/2023. On 11/29/2023, I emailed Capt. Chris Rodewalt, GSP, Capt. Chris Hodge, DNR to let them know of the dates and our intent to ask for assistance again. In this email, I stated I would reach out to each of them after the holidays to schedule a meeting.
- On 01/05/2024, I sent an email to Capt. Chris Rodewalt, GSP, and Capt. Chris Hodge, DNR requesting a meeting at the end of the month. Both replied and a meeting was scheduled for 01/23 at 1000 hrs. (please see attached BRIEF)
- CCSO Deputy Chief Gary Taylor was also invited to this meeting via telephone and attended via conference call.
- Additionally, there will be a road safety checkpoint.

8) Have we completed a written full risk assessment for Orange Crush? Can that be shared with council?

- The police department did an after-action review with command staff and officers after the first Orange Crush. We did not do a full risk assessment. Peach Fest was the following weekend and was handled extremely differently. "Turnt" Island was the event from June 30th-July 3rd. This event had better preparations and is documented in an operations plan. This can be viewed by the city council. Additionally, command staff visited Jax Beach to observe the way they operated and handled Orange Crush Festival 2023.
- 9) Can we manage density for crowd size in areas on the beach?
- 10) Are we closing off Tybrisa and portion of South parking lot for additional pedestrian zones to traffic as per Pirate Fest or is parking a greater need?
 - Currently, we do not plan on closing Tybrisa or the south end parking lots. Once the parking lots are full, we work closely with parking services to close the parking lots to additional traffic.
- 11) Do we need any additional signs in support of the event? Bathrooms, Security, Health Aid?
 - The city supplies port o johns in the south end parking lots.
- 12) What is the emergency plan for orderly evacuation of high density areas in case of gun fight, riot, other high injury potentials? Can that be shared with city council?
 - Officers will do their best to clear the area as orderly as possible while securing a potential crime scene and tending to the wounded. This is difficult in an open-air area where there is no set entry or exit.
- 13) Should metal detectors be used in high density areas (including outside venues) for crowd protection?
- 14) What are the traffic plans for the island?

• Traffic will be monitored throughout the shifts. The Shift Supervisor will stay in contact with the Parking Services Supervisor in the event any parking lots need to be CLOSED or in the event of gridlock. Extra personnel may be used to assist with the flow of traffic at the below intersections. Traffic protocols for holiday weekends will be in effect with barriers strategically placed from 15th Street to 17th Street from 04/19-04/21. Specifically, on 4/20/2024, barricades will be placed at the cross streets on Butler Avenue, to aid in keeping traffic out of the neighborhoods and flowing outbound traffic on Butler Avenue to Highway 80.

An Emergency Lane (EM) will be utilized for Public Safety purposes from 4/19/2024 through 4/21/2024. The EM will be maintained from the Lazaretto Creek Bridge eastbound to Tybrisa Street. The EM will be staffed with members of the Georgia State Patrol and the Georgia Motor Carrier Division.

23) What housing and food support for city staffing is being provided by the community at cost or no cost?

- Command Staff and Chief Kendrick, TIFD, met with STVR companies and owners of hotel/motels on 01/23/2024. This was asked of each company. We will follow up with each company in the near future.
- Food, as of now, is still in discussion.

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b. Summarize Police/EMS/Fire/Public Works responses to last years events including weapons confiscated and other high risks concerns

- 15 firearms were taken off the street during Orange Crush and Peach Fest. 2 of these firearms were reported stolen and the cases were referred to the ATF.
- During Orange Crush officers utilized pepper ball due to the crowd throwing glass bottles at them. Several officers were struck with glass bottles including the head. Once pepper ball was deployed shots were fired from the crowd.
- One police vehicle was damaged from attendees stomping on the hood and roof.
- Aggravated Assault with a vehicle
